Criminal Background Checks: An applicant to a nursing program who has been convicted of or pled guilty to a felony or misdemeanor (excluding a minor traffic violation) may not be eligible for licensure by the N.C. Board of Nursing.

The North Carolina Board of Nursing requires Criminal History Record Checks of all persons applying to practice Nursing in the State of North Carolina. Applicants will be charged a fee to offset the cost of this background check.

Affiliating agencies with which the College has contracted to provide clinical experiences may require nursing students to submit to criminal background checks and/or drug testing prior to or during participation in clinical experiences at their site. Students who are denied placement at a clinical site will be unable to complete the required clinical component of the course and will be dismissed from the program.

Waiting List: Qualified applicants who are accepted after the programs are filled will be placed on a waiting list. A minimum of 15 persons will be listed in ranked order for the nursing programs. Applicants on a waiting list will be notified if a vacancy arises in the program of their choice for that year. Applicants on the waiting list for fall admission in one year will not be automatically carried over to the following year(s). The applicant must REAPPLY to be considered for admission in the following year(s). (APP: Admissions Committee, 10/1/93)

Review of Applicants

The Nursing Admissions Committee reviews the applicants in stages utilizing the following criteria:

Associate Degree Nursing - ADN

1. Required minimum scores on reading, writing, numerical, and algebra as measured by the ACCUPLACER/CPT, ASSET or COMPASS placement tests and minimum score on computer placement test or completion of CIS 070 with grade of "C" or better.

2. Completion of the required Chemistry course.
3. ACT Scores.
4. Grades from the following courses or equivalents, if taken:

BIO 166	Anatomy and Physiology II
PSY 150	General Psychology
PSY 241	Developmental Psychology
ENG 111	Expository Writing
ENG 113	Literature-Based Research
5. Qualified ADN applicants must submit a completed application by the March deadline to be considered for the first review of applications.

Practical Nursing - PN

1. Required minimum scores on reading, writing, numerical, and algebra as measured by the ACCUPLACER/CPT, ASSET or COMPASS placements tests and minimum score on computer placement test or completion of CIS 070 with grade of "C" or better.
2. Completion of the required chemistry course.
3. Grades from the following courses or equivalents, if taken:

BIO 163	Basic Anatomy and Physiology
PSY 150	General Psychology
ENG 111	Expository Writing
4. Overall GPA (college or unweighted high school).
5. Qualified PN applicants must submit a completed application by the April deadline to be considered for the first review of applications.

Note: Applicants completing all requirements after the ADN and PN deadlines will be considered by the Admissions Committee at subsequent meetings until the programs are filled.
