The types of financial assistance available for the summer term are limited compared to the fall and spring terms. Funds offered by the state of North Carolina are <u>not</u> available during the summer term and the Federal Pell Grant can be offered only if you have funds remaining for the 2015-2016 academic year.

All Summer 2016 aid is based on the results of your 2015-2016 FAFSA. If you have not already done so, please complete the 2015-2016 FAFSA online at www.fafsa.gov and submit any additional documentation requested by the Financial Aid Office to complete your financial aid file.

## \*\*IMPORTANT NOTE FOR STUDENTS WHO ARE ON FINANCIAL AID WARNING/SUSPENSION\*\*

- If you are currently on Financial Aid Warning, Probation on Appeal or Financial Aid Suspension for the 2016 Spring Semester and choose to register during the registration period of April 13 14, 2016, <u>financial aid WILL NOT be available to charge tuition/fees or books/supplies to your account</u>. Therefore, if you choose to register during this period, you will be responsible for paying your tuition by 4:00 p.m. on May 4, 2016.
- Summer financial aid <u>will not</u> be applied to your account until <u>all</u> spring grades have been officially posted and your academic
  progress has been reviewed and your eligibility confirmed. If you are unable to pay your tuition charges before May 4, 2016, you
  may wish to consider registering for classes on May 23, 2016.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SUMMER FINANCIAL AID

- ♦ To be eligible for financial aid, you must be accepted into an approved certificate, diploma, or associate degree program at WCC.
- Full-time status for the Summer Pell Grant is <u>12 or more credit hours</u>. Students enrolling in less than 12 credit hours may have their aid prorated accordingly.
- Pell Grant applicants must have remaining eligibility for the current academic year. If our office receives information from the federal database that you have exceeded your annual maximum because of aid received at another institution during the 2015-2016 academic year, you will be required to return all or a portion of the aid received from WCC.
- As with fall and spring semesters, Pell Grant funds for summer are paid based upon enrollment status at the 10% point of the semester. Please remember financial aid funds will not pay for No-Shows (NA), Audits (AU), or Test Outs/Credit by Exam (X). If you are reported by your instructors as having received one of the above, your aid will be reduced or eliminated accordingly and you will be responsible for any outstanding charges on your account.
- If it becomes necessary to change your schedule <u>after</u> you have registered for the summer term, all adjustments must be made by officially dropping or withdrawing from the course(s) by the dates posted in the Summer Schedule of Courses. Also, you should consult with the Financial Aid office to determine how any schedule adjustment will affect your financial aid award.
- Financial aid funds will not pay for classes that fall outside of your primary major. If it is determined that you are taking classes that are not approved for your curriculum, your aid will be reduced or eliminated accordingly and you will be responsible for any outstanding charges on your account.
- ♦ Tuition/Fees: Credit to account or Refund
  - 100% of tuition will be refunded or credited to account for students who officially withdraw from classes <u>before</u> the first day
    of the term and no charges will be posted to the student's account.
  - 75% of tuition will be refunded or credited to account for students who officially withdraw from classes before the 10% point of the term. This means that the student will be financially responsible for the 25% portion of tuition not refunded, regardless of source of funding (*Pell Grant, scholarships, etc.*)
  - No refund or credit to account will be given for classes dropped after the 10% point of the semester. This means the student will be financially responsible for 100% of tuition and fees, regardless of the original source (*Pell Grant,* scholarships, etc.)
  - In the event that anticipated financial aid is **NOT** awarded, the student is responsible for any balance due on their account.
- Eligibility to receive a summer Pell Grant is based upon remaining eligibility for the 2015-2016 academic year, SAP status, indebtedness to the college, attendance, and/or the receipt of Pell Grant funds at another institution during the 2015-2016 academic year.
- All correspondence to students regarding summer financial aid awards will be sent to the address on file in the Office of Admissions and Records.
- Students who are NOT eligible for the summer Pell Grant should make arrangements to pay any outstanding balance to the Business Office by 4:00 p.m. on May 4, 2016. Failure to pay outstanding balances by the due date will result in the cancellation of all registered classes.

If you do not understand any of the above listed policies and procedures, it is your responsibility to ask for clarification from a financial aid counselor. Financial Aid counselors are available Monday through Thursday from 7:45 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. and Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. The Financial Aid office also has evening hours every Tuesday until 7:00 p.m. **\*\*Summer hours may** *vary*\*\*
