### TUITION AND FEES REFUND POLICY

In accordance with NCAC 2D.0202, a refund can not be made except under the following circumstances:

- 1) A 100 percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws prior to the first day of class(es) or the academic semester as noted in the college calendar. Also, a student is eligible for a 100 percent refund if the class in which the student is officially registered fails to "make" due to insufficient enrollment.
- 2) A 75 percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from the class(es) prior to or on the official 10 percent point of the semester. **(January 15)**
- 3) For classes beginning at times other than the first week (seven calendar days) of the semester, a 100 percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from the class prior to the first class meeting. A 75 percent refund shall be made if the student officially withdraws from the class prior to or on the 10 percent point of the class.
