Students who have graduated from a North Carolina high school within 5 years of college enrollment with at least a 2.6 GPA (unweighted) and completion of four high school math courses (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and one eligible math course are exempt from placement testing for math, reading, writing, and computer skills.

- Students who are currently-enrolled North Carolina high school seniors and are applying early for college
  admission who have a 2.6 GPA (unweighted) from the first semester senior year and have completed four high
  school math courses (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and one eligible math
  course are exempt from placement testing for math, reading, writing, and computer skills.
- Students are responsible for submitting an official high school transcript to Wayne Community College Office of Admissions and Records.
- Students are responsible for notifying Wayne Community College (Admissions or Counseling Services) that they meet the above criteria.
- Students who meet the above criteria and are exempt from placement testing are still encouraged to take the placement tests in order to best determine current skill levels in relation to college class requirements.
- Students who have an ACT or SAT score that is less than 5 years old and meets the minimum score requirements will not be required to take that part of the placement test:

Math: ACT Math = 22 or higher or SAT Math = 500 or higher

Reading/English: ACT Reading = 22 or higher or ACT English = 18 or higher

or SAT Critical Reading or Writing = 500 or higher

• Students applying for a limited admission program (Allied Health, BLET) should always refer to specific program requirements.
