Purpose: To ensure programmatic coursework prepares student to competently practice in their chosen profession.

Description: Aggregate institutional passing rate of first time test-takers on licensure and certification exams. Exams included in this measure are state mandated exams which candidates must pass before becoming active practitioners.

Denominator: All licensure and certification exams taken for the first-time during the licensure agency's most recent reporting year. Only includes state mandated exams which candidates must pass before becoming active practitioners.

Numerator: Of those in the denominator, the number passing exam on first attempt during the licensure agency's most recent reporting year.

Each program has developed their strategy for assessment and evaluation purposes to continue to enhance the growth of the program, increase enrollment, enhance student skills or workforce credentials, as well as developing the student's academic success for completion of the programs.

Most programs were successful in meeting their standard for their licensure and certification programs, however BLET and EMS was not successful in meeting the state standards for this year. (NOTE: There was some problematic errors discovered with the newly revised BLET state exam and created some overwhelming deficiencies across the state. Although there was some validation errors for some of the questions discovered by the N.C. Department of Justice, the student's tests were not re-graded if they were not a "Fatal Failure", since Wayne did not have any "Fatal Failures" our students test were not re-graded and we resulted in have 4 deficiencies recorded for the Performance Data Report.)

Aviation did not meet their strategies for increasing enrollment and course completion, as well as the passing rate for the licensure/certification exam also decreased by an overall of 2%.

Nursing met all of the strategies that was set for the academic year and achieved 100% satisfaction rating from the students and faculty through student and faculty feedback. Nursing met the standard for the licensure/certification pass rate, however they had a 3.5% overall decrease in their passing rate for the state exam.

Dental faculty have met their strategies for the academic year. Dental Hygiene students exceeded the standard for performance measures with an overall of 82%, however did not meet the target for the performance measures. There was a 6% decrease in the pass rate for this academic year on the state exam for dental hygiene.
