Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students Reporting

In compliance with requirements of the American Rescue Plan (ARP), Wayne Community College (WCC) acknowledges that the College signed and returned to the Department of Education, the College's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the ARP. This acknowledgement affirms that the College has used, or intends to use, the student allotment portion of the funds received under Section 2003(a)(1) of the ARP to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

The College was funded \$3,177,613 from the Department of Education in ARP Emergency Relief funds pursuant to the College's Certification of Agreement for Financial Aid Grants to Students.

The method used by the College to establish which Curriculum students were eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants via an automatic award used information obtained from various departments including Admission and Records and Financial Aid and Veteran Services to determine:

- Enrollment in the semester during which funds are awarded
- Enrollment and/or acceptance for enrollment in an eligible degree or certificate program
- Student has a valid social security number
- Student is a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or eligible non-citizen
- Student completed a FAFSA with a valid EFC.

As of the closing date of this report (December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021), the College has distributed \$781,233.34 to 1489 unduplicated students.

The estimated total number of the College's students eligible to be considered for an Emergency Financial Aid Grants to student under Section 2003(a)(1) of the ARP as of December 31, 2021 is 1692.

WCC used a team of staff including the Director Financial Aid and Veteran Services, Associate Director Financial Aid, VP Academic and Student Services, Associate VP of Academic and Student Services, Comptroller, Vice President for Workforce, Continuing Education and Community Engagement and Vice President of Administrative and Financial Services/Chief Financial Officer to identify, strategize, and plan for timely disbursement of ARP Emergency Grant funding.

Students who are determined eligible for the ARP Emergency Grant funding will receive an email stating:

*Dear Student,*

*WCC recognizes the ongoing challenges you may be experiencing because of the COVID-19 pandemic. We understand the importance of your education and wish to make every resource available to you to help you continue your education at the College.*

*The American Rescue Plan (ARP) provides additional funding for student financial aid grants through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF III). Recipients of a HEERF III grant may use the funds for expenses including tuition, food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and childcare. In addition, students may, but are not required to, use the funds to satisfy an outstanding account balance.*

Our records show that you may be eligible for a HEERF III grant during your enrollment. Awarding of these funds will be based on enrollment status and financial need as determined by the FAFSA (EFC ranges 0 - 8500) for the academic year you are awarded. If you wish any amount you are awarded to be applied to an outstanding account balance, please email [Wendy Potter](mailto:Wendy.Potter@waynecc.edu) or call 919-739-7093. If you do not qualify for the automatic award, you may complete an application and describe the financial impact Covid 19 has had on you and your family. WCC will allocate federal student emergency grants to curriculum students who are enrolled in eligible degree programs, if students have a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file for the academic year, using the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) to establish the level of need. WCC will also consider the enrollment status for the semester when determining the award amounts.

Students whose EFC exceeds \$8,500 or who did not complete a FAFSA may complete an application to demonstrate the need for emergency funds. Additionally, students awarded through the above matrix, can complete the same application to demonstrate they have need beyond the standard award. Students can apply and be awarded each semester they attend. The application is located on the Financial Aid Online Forms page, or can be accessed directly by clicking [here](#). Award amounts for the application will be as follows:

Fulltime	\$550
Three Quarter time	\$375
Half time	\$200
Quarter time	\$ 75
Less than ¼ time	\$ 35

Students are advised to contact the office of Financial Aid and Veteran Services with any questions.

Students who have past due balances, created on or after March 13, 2020, can be awarded an amount up to the balance on their account. In these instances, the institution is defining need by the balance since the balance is preventing the student from furthering his education. When the institution awards a student with a previous balance, the student must complete a post card verifying his mailing address. The same post card allows the student to select whether to have the funds posted to his student account or mailed to the address being verified on the postcard. The institution will also accept an email from the student with the same information. Verbal permission to post the funds to a student account are not acceptable.

In rare instances, students who do not meet the requirements previously described have been determined to have need or to exceed the defined need. In these instances, an award can exceed the amount defined based on the professional judgement of the FA administrator. Exceptions in these instances will consider the students need for funds necessary to continue their education. Including, but not limited to, books, transportation, childcare expenses etc. to justify the award or increased award amount.

As of the closing date of this report (December 31, 2021) checks were prepared and mailed to 1422 Curriculum students totaling \$767,680.62 during the quarter ending December 31, 2021. A cumulative total of 1427 curriculum students received a total of \$770,408.34 from the ARP Emergency Grant funding.

Continuing Education students are eligible for funds from ARP. Students will be notified by making in person announcements in classes that included contact information for the scholarship/grant coordinator in Workforce Continuing Education. In addition, the following social media post will be made periodically:

Are you enrolled in a Workforce CE occupational course this semester, or did you complete a course this semester? If your course was/is ten (10) hours or more in length, you are eligible to apply for HEERF III Funds. Students must demonstrate need by supplying documents as indicated on the application. Students will receive an amount based on the hours of their course.

Applications may be found on our WCE Scholarship webpage under the heading OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE and must be turned in along with documentation to Maxine Cooper.

Applications were accepted throughout the Fall 2021 semester.

Award amounts are determined by the cost of attendance and need is determined by the student status of unemployed or underemployed.

As of the closing date of this report (December 31, 2021) checks were prepared and mailed to 54 Continuing Education students totaling \$10,545 during the quarter ending December 31, 2021. A cumulative total of 55 continuing education students received a total of \$10,825 from the ARP Emergency Grant funding.
