WCC has been named a 2023-2024 MilitaryFriendly® School for the 10th time. The college also earned "gold" award status in the small community college category for leading practices, outcomes, and effective programs.

The Golden LEAF Foundation Board of Directors has awarded \$225,000 to WCC. The funds will pay for equipment, personnel, and supplies to renovate classroom and lab space at Southern Wayne High School for expanded workforce training in welding, equipment repair, and safety. The high school will use the space during the day. The college will offer adult learners short-term training there at night and on weekends with a bilingual instructor for Spanish-speaking students.

WCC's Upsilon Chi chapter was one of 294 Phi Theta Kappa honor society chapters internationally that were recognized for membership development efforts. It was named a 2023 REACH Chapter and awarded five free stoles.

The WCC Small Business Center named JOY Filled Foods its 2022 Small Business of the Year Award and Speckled Fawns its 2022 Small Business Start-Up of the Year. Both were members of the last LAUNCH Goldsboro cohort.


